He is the recent ex Chairman of the Urological Society of Australia and New Zealand's Endourology Special Advisory Group.

His fellowship year was centred on advanced laparoscopy, implant surgery and open complex urological cancers. His post fellowship training has been in world renowned centres in robotic surgery, USC in California and Asian University in Seoul, Korea.

George is actively involved in teaching the next generation of surgeons and is a member of the Royal Australasian College of Surgeon's Academy of Surgical Educators. He also consistently participates in multidisciplinary team meetings, audit, radiology and morbidity meetings. Special interest areas:

- · Implant, continence surgery and urodynamics
- · All aspects of general urology: laser stone surgery, vasectomy, circumcision
